Grow Business and Develop Leaders

We focus on growing our many leadership networks, such as Billings NextGEN, Women's Leadership Network and Leadership Billings. We encourage collaboration, cross participation and the strengthening of our workforce development partnerships.

As always, we are a champion for the business community through our promotion of both resident and executive relocation to Billings, and by connecting our members to meaningful engagement experiences, worthwhile benefits, and industry support and resources that facilitate business success.

Lead Visitor Growth

The Chamber is proud to manage our region's Destination Leadership Organizations - Visit Billings and Visit Southeast Montana. Visit Billings drives leisure visitation to Montana's City and advocates for local tourism. Additionally, they strive to promote Billings as a premier destination for meetings and conventions, with a long range plan focused on youth sports recruitment, sports facilities, awareness and supporting signature events.

Visit Southeast Montana covers a vast region of thirteen counties and two reservations. Their goal is to foster visitation and growth, creating strong businesses in the region that bolster Billings' economy. They do this through a 25-stop Burger Trail, an award-winning Montana's Trail to the Stars, the launch of Montana's Great Wide Open, road trips from the Badlands to Breaks to Beartooths, and an upcoming launch of a regional ambassador program.



Influence Government Policy

We are a leader in public policy advocacy, working at the local, state and federal levels to ignite change and spur economic growth. We drive discussions designed specifically to solve problems for businesses by prioritizing public safety, addressing housing supply issues, and focusing on workforce attainment.

We foster bipartisanship and radical collaboration to accomplish these goals, and we are steadfast in the endorsement of business-friendly candidates and providing them opportunities to engage with Chamber members and the community. We are leading the charge to grow air service in Billings, working toward new targeted destinations, airline conversations, and taking into consideration the travel needs of the business community.

We continue to identify and lead transformational projects that increase visitor stays and encourage relocation to Billings. We actively collaborate with our partners to encourage talent recruitment, support downtown development and vibrancy, lead efforts for more trail connections and parks, and encourage sports facilities to grow sports tourism.

We believe it is important to be a city of belonging and inclusivity. All our staff have undergone training to be Certified Tourism Ambassadors (CTA) and have earned this certification. Additionally, we are a Certified Autism Center (CAC) by the IBCCES - the first destination in Montana to complete this designation. All staff members and executive committee members have completed autism and sensory awareness training, and our tourism partners have earned the Certified Autism Travel Planner certifications.
